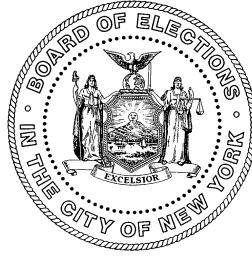


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## BOARD OF ELECTIONS

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### STATEMENT OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF ELECTIONS IN THE CITY OF NEW YORK WITH RESPECT TO THE JULY 1, 2007 CHANGE IN ZIP CODES WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF MANHATTAN

**In response to inquiries from the public regarding the United States Postal Service change of Zip Codes within the Borough of Manhattan, effective July 1, 2007, dividing Zip Code 10021 into three (3) Zip Codes: 10021; 10065; & 10075 and the 2007 Designating Petition Process, the Commissioners of Elections in the City of New York adopt this statement of policy regarding this issue and the 2007 Designating Petition Process:**

**The Board of Elections in the City of New York determines that for the purposes of the 2007 Designating Petition Process, the Board will consider and deem valid as part of an address located in Manhattan, the Zip Code in effect on June 12, 2007, the first day to circulate designating petitions and will deem any challenge that the address appearing on a petition is not valid as a result of the July 1, 2007 modification of Zip Codes in Manhattan to be a frivolous objection.**
